

Motion Perception Study at UCLA

A research study on properties of motion perception is underway at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) but is *currently placing subjects on a waiting list*. This study is focused on subjects over the age of 21 who suffer from a motion perception problem such as *mal de débarquement syndrome* or spontaneous onset of self-motion perceptions like episodic vertigo, severe motion sickness, or sensitivity to visual motion. The study is also recruiting control subjects ages 21 years and older who do not suffer from any kind of motion sickness or motion perception problem.

Participation will require clearing a brief screening interview over the telephone. If qualified to enter the study, the initial study will entail one hour and involves some questionnaires and several computer generated visual motion tasks

A subset of qualified subjects will be invited to undergo a functional MRI scan of the brain and/or PET scan. Payment for parking and compensation offered for all components of the study.
